### 118TH U.S. OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

fter much anticipation, the U.S. Open Championship returns to the Met Area and Shinnecock Hills in June for its 118th edition. Once the first tee shot is struck, there will be plenty of numbers to keep track of, but here are a few figures to know as **USGA** and MGA charter member Shinnecock Hills welcomes its fifth U.S. Open Championship.

9.049 – Number of entries the USGA accepted for the 2018 U.S. Open. The final field will be comprised of 156 players.

**276** – Winning score from the 2004 U.S. Open at Shinnecock Hills, won by Retief Goosen (-4).

45+ - Hours of network coverage for the U.S. Open on Fox and FS1. More than 115 hours will be available via live streaming.

**37,000** – Size in square feet of the merchandise "tent" constructed for the 2018 U.S. Open.

2 – Number of holes in the new playoff format for the U.S. Open. In the event of a tie, it would take place following the completion of the 72 holes of stroke play.

7,445 - The total yardage at which the course can play from its back tees. Each round will vary due to course setup and conditions.

4 – Number of holes played in the USGA's Celebration of Champions, a June 12 public exhibition at Shinnecock Hills honoring winners of all 2017 USGA championships.

41.57 – In yards, average width of fairway driving zones. This compares to an average of 26.57 yards in 2004's U.S. Open.

**5** – Number of qualifying rounds for the 118th U.S. Open Championship conducted by the MGA this year, including the June 4 sectional at Canoe Brook Country Club in Summit, N.J.

# The Call for the Hall



fter sorting through its 118 years of golf history, the New Jersey State Golf Association selected 16 of the state's most influential names and welcomed them as the inaugural class of NJSGA Hall of Fame inductees in a May 1 ceremony. Many of those inducted left their mark beyond the bounds of New Jersey, including amateur Bob Housen.

Following the suggestion of an area professional, Housen—79 and a longtime member of Manasquan River—began competing in championships in his 30s and just hoped to play well. "I never in my wildest dreams ever envisioned that I would win six State Amateur Championships or be in six U.S. Senior Opens and play with the likes of Gary Player and Jack Nicklaus," said Housen, who finished as low amateur in the U.S. Senior Open in both 1988 and 1995.

For Housen, playing the game provided a quality platform for helping others while also keeping different elements of life in perspective. "I always felt I had to keep everything in balance and the one that helped me to do that the best was my wife Marjorie, she is just wonderful," Housen expressed.

Housen also owns five MGA titles, having won the Ike in 1976, the MGA Senior Amateur in 1997 and 1999 and the Father & Son Championship in 1996 and 2008. He was also part of the very first Governor Hugh L. Carey Challenge Cup in 1990. "It's very humbling to say the least," says Housen of the recognition.





A stellar 69.79 stroke average and seven top-10 finishes, including a win in the Schenkel Invitational, led Humphrey to SEC Player of the Year honors. Humphrey has risen as high as eighth in WAGR this season and was also named SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year. The Commodores close the season at the NCAA Championship, May 25-30.

Nicholas won his first collegiate title at the Cornell Invitational in the fall and continued his high level of play throughout the season en route to Ivy League Player of the Year honors. 
CHRISTINA PARSELLS Georgetown University Junior • Bernardsville, N.J.




CAMERON YOUNG

ittsburgh's golf reputation is buoyed by historic clubs such as Oakmont and Fox Chapel, but the Steel City and western Pennsylvania is also rich with public playing opportunities in all directions.

The new Shepherd's Rock course, designed by Pete Dye and Tim Liddy, perfectly complements Dye's testing Mystic Rock course at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort.

#### **COURSES:**

- 1 Nemacolin Woodlands Resort Though 60 miles southeast of Pittsburgh, a trip to Nemacolin is well worth the trip for the resort's two world-class layouts. The PGA TOUR tested Mystic Rock provides plenty of challenge and risk-reward opportunities, while Shepherd's Rock—new in 2017—features wide, sloping fairways and elevation changes that help deliver scenic views of the Allegheny Mountains.
- 2 Totteridge Golf Course East of Pittsburgh, this Rees Jones links-style design stretches over 7100 yards. Players shouldn't take the open layout for granted though as missing the undulating fairways can prove penal due to traditionally thick rough. Its greens, most of which are open in the front, are known for rolling pure and fast.
- 3 Pittsburgh National Golf Club North of the city, Pittsburgh National sits on an elevated property and was once a private club. Several holes wind through rolling wooded areas, while others cross relatively open terrain, providing a mix of both challenging and inviting opportunities throughout the round. Elevation changes add to the variety and scenery.

Remembering Doug Ford

fter learning and sharpening his game on public courses around New York City, Doug Ford became one of the PGA TOUR's earliest icons. Ford, who passed this month at the age of 95, won 19 events on TOUR, including the 1955 PGA Championship and 1957 Masters; but, his win in the 1956 Met Open could be considered the "turning point" in his career.

According to a 1957 Sports Illustrated story, Ford was so discouraged with his play the prior year that he had taken about six months off. "My game had become so conservative that I had just about stopped scoring," Ford said. All that changed with his victory at Inwood Country Club. After fading the ball for years, Ford was forced to change his game plan, saying, "the wind was blowing like hell and I had to switch tactics and start hooking the ball into the wind." He entered the final round five strokes back, but with the wind relenting, Ford fired a 7-under 66 to win by three strokes and claim his first victory in a year.

Reinvigorated by the victory, Ford opened 1957 with wins at the Los Angeles and Panamas Opens and claimed the Masters in April, paving the way for the remainder of his Hall of Fame career.

During his early years Ford, whose father was a PGA Professional, spent time as a pro at several Met Area clubs, including Putnam, Tam O'Shanter and Spook Rock.
