ix different handicap systems exist across the world today. That all changes in 2020, when the World Handicap System - developed by the USGA and R&A with input from existing handicapping authorities - makes its debut.

Designed to encourage more golfers to obtain a handicap, the new system will provide a consistent measure of playing ability while producing handicaps that are portable from course to course, country to country. The new system makes it easier to first establish a handicap and increases the max handicap, making it more accessible and inclusive than ever before. With handicaps updating daily under the WHS, a number of new safeguards will ensure accuracy and limit extreme fluctuations.



fter an admittedly slow start to the season, Brad Tilley of Sleepy Hollow dialed in his equipment and went to work on his game, even receiving some help from friend and European Tour player Hugo Leon. He advanced to match play at the Met Amateur, and then continued to grind on his game in preparation for a busy stretch of fall golf. His three Mid-Amateur trophies prove that the work has paid off.

"It's unbelievable," said Tilley of the accomplishment. Until Tilley, no player had even won all three in their career. "I would have been really happy to be in contention in any of them or win one. To be able to come pull it off for three in a row and to be an MGA champion again is a massive honor."

Tilley claimed the title in wire-to-wire fashion and was the only player to turn in three sub-par scores as he shot a record-setting 9-under-par 204 to win by seven shots.

Oct. 3-4 | WGA Mid-Am
Tamarack Country Club | Greenwich, Conn.

Tilley called his 2-under 70 during the opening round's cold, rainy conditions one of his best of the year. The score separated himself from the field and after a windy final round, Tilley won by three shots.

Oct. 7-8 | MGA Mid-Am Wee Burn Country Club | Darien, Conn.

The feat didn't come without dramatics, as Tilley drained a par-saving, 50-foot putt on the final hole after hitting his initial tee shot out of bounds. He had entered the day one shot back, but the putt proved to be the exclamation point on his outstanding run.

ne of golf's biggest icons, Gary Player, came back to a course he's very familiar with, hosting the 2019
Berenberg Gary Player Invitational at GlenArbor
Golf Club on October 7. As part of The Player Foundation's global series, the event benefits underprivileged children and communities across the world.

Player might know GlenArbor's course better than anyone; he designed the course that opened in 1996 and refers to the sprawling layout in Bedford Hills, N.Y., as his "masterpiece." He brought a few friends to New York with

him: 14 Major Champions, 6 Ryder Cup stars and other top players from the tours around the world, including Mark O'Meara, Morgan Pressel, Beatriz Recari, Azahara Muñoz, Fred Couples, Lee Trevino, and native Long Islander and LPGA Tour winner Annie Park (pictured top right with Tom Lehman).

Speaking to the media before the tournament began, Player said, "Out of all the things I have achieved in my life and career, I am most proud of the impact The Player Foundation has made on those in need. From ensuring

proper education for underserved youth to helping communities in need, my Foundation continues to be the driving force behind all that I do."

Player teamed up for an afternoon of golf with LPGA European Tour star Azahara Muñoz and added another win to his golf resume as their team took home the Baobab Tree Trophy after a sudden death playoff.

The entire event was the perfect example of golf's true impact and the power that the game has in bringing people together to give back, raising more than \$114,000.

Black and White and Cred Cred All Over

mong Odyssey's 18 different Stroke Lab putters are shapes for every taste. But Phil Mickelson – among other Tour pros – have begun playing a brand-new model. Just debuted, the Stroke Lab Ten Black is already the brand's No. 1 putter on the PGA Tour. The super-high MOI, multi-material mallet features the Stroke Lab shaft that redistributes saved weight toward the head and grip. That completely re-balances the putter, to help improve tempo and consistency. Its head weight is out toward the perimeter, to improve inertia. The forgiving putter also sports a new Microhinge Star insert that feels firm, sounds solid and rolls true. The hi-def, thick-white-line-on-a-black-crown alignment system eases the process of aiming. "We want this to be super easy to align, and for it to literally be a point-and-shoot product," says Sean Toulon, senior vice president of Callaway and general manager of Odyssey. The company also unveiled a sibling model, the **Stroke** Lab Black Bird Of Prey. Officials say it showcases one of the most distinct head shapes they've ever made yet has all of the physical characteristics and performance benefits of the Ten Black. Each of the new putters sells for \$300, and will be available in November.


